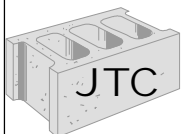

MEETING OF PROSPECTIVE ALLOTMENT HOLDERS

CAYTHORPE VILLAGE HALL

TUESDAY 2 SEPTEMBER AT 7PM

Following the good news that the 'Big Lottery' grant we applied for last year has at last been approved, the Parish Council is now in a position to consider the way forward regarding the likely provision of allotments on land adjacent to the burial ground off Gorse Hill Lane.

However the grant alone is insufficient to cover the full costs of providing the allotments and the Parish Council has agreed that before it takes a decision on the funding gap, a number of steps need to be taken in order that the project can be taken forward. The first and most important of these is to confirm that prospective tenants of the allotments are still committed to the project.

Further that all parties understand that the Parish Council will require that an 'Allotment Association' is formed which will manage the day to day running of the allotments, complying with the terms of an agreement that will be drawn up by the council.

The subject meeting has been arranged between members of the Parish Council and all interested residents to gain endorsement of the proposal to form an Allotment Association.

Subject that the Parish Council is happy with the outcome of this meeting we will proceed to the next step, if not the project will not proceed.

Caythorpe and District Garden Society

According to our speaker for August, there is no excuse for failing to grow at least some of your own vegetables. Geoff Hodge, botanist, gardener, writer and broadcaster explained that commercially grown vegetables are selected for looks and durability, but we can choose from hundreds of varieties available as seed to get the best flavours and the freshest vegetables from our own gardens. In a lively and amusing presentation Geoff scolded that lack of space, or even soil, is no handicap, as vegetables can be tucked into flower borders or grown in containers, provided you match the container to the plant's needs.

Sowing seeds properly is the essential first step: prepare a fine seed bed then read the packet to find the appropriate sowing depth and the temperature for germination, as nothing may happen if the soil/compost is too cold or, for some plants, too warm. In the open ground station sowing, i.e. placing a few seeds at the spacing required by the growing plants, then removing surplus seedlings, saves both seed and effort. Geoff recommended using a good bought compost in containers rather than trying to make your own (though not all the audience were convinced), and using small pots rather than seed trays to get a better depth of soil and less root disturbance when planting out or potting on. Sowing little and often will avoid a glut – don't grow more than you can use or your efforts will be wasted.

We also got advice on watering, the use of various tools (long handles avoid backache); weed killers (glyphosate is best) and plant food (seaweed makes the plant grow stronger); and a warning against grow bags, which Geoff felt are very difficult to manage successfully outside a commercial environment. One tip that surprised most of us was to leave tomato plants in 3 ½ inch pots until the first flowers appear to avoid lanky plants that won't fruit low down on the stem – certainly something to try next year. Our thanks to Geoff for sharing his expertise in such an entertaining way.

The next meeting will be on September 9th at 7:30 in Carlton Scroop village hall. Sally Smith will be speaking on 'Creation of a Pond'. Parish Council NewsSeptember 2014.

AllotmentsAs previously reported we have been successful in receiving a grant for £10,000 which will help pay for some but by no means all of the costs of this project if it is given the final go ahead by your Parish Council. In order that we can explain to residents what will be involved, if they wish to have an allotment, we are holding a meeting in the Village Hall on Tuesday September 2nd at 7.00pm. This meeting is important as we need to be sure that there are a sufficient number of residents who are willing to commit to having an allotment in order that we can then look to spending funds from our reserves which together with the grant are necessary in order to get the project up and running. Please come to the meeting as your views on this initiative are very welcome even if you are not looking to put your name down for an allotment. (see pg 14)

Playing Fields Committee.....It is pleasing to note that they have been awarded a grant of £8500 which is to be used to block pave the entrance way to the playing fields to the right hand side of the pavilion. The current entrance is not at all user friendly for those residents with young children in prams and push chairs, nor for the elderly and is often very muddy during periods of wet weather.

Rural Beat Office....There are new discussions taking place with Lincolnshire Police over the future use of this property. Whilst this was an issue several years ago the decision was taken by them to retain the property principally for their own use at that point in time. The current discussions are at an early stage and will be reported on in due course.
