

MINUTES OF SPEED SIGN DISCUSSION HELD AT THE ROSE AND CROWN 27th OCTOBER 2016.

Meeting commenced at 7.30.pm

PRESENT: J Allan. R Gore. C Cuckson. L Holman.

Ron Gore informed the group about the speed signage at Marton, which is a fixed permanent sign but is movable to another blank plate on which they are fixed.

Other options are small fixed sign which flashes 30 to oncoming motorists, the movable S.I.D. (Speed Indication Display) and the free 30mph passive signs. 6 are free but the parish council has to pay L.C.C. £40 for a one off survey. 30mph wheelie bin stickers were also discussed. They are 50p each with a minimum order of 40 from Lincolnshire Road Safety.

Areas were discussed where to place permanent movable signs. Padmoor Lane up towards Barnes was suggested, entrance to village at both ends, Kexby corner from Kexby Lane and Village Hall area.

Clare Cuckson brought up an individual case of speeding through Kexby, and it was suggested to target that particular person with a letter.

Jamie Allan asked the group, how big do we want to be? How much for signs? Where is best place for them? Maybe approach highways on best possible places for best impact.

7 Minor accidents in 11 years with 6 being in Kexby.

Ron Gore to find out more information about Morton's sign and whether they had funds.

There are 2 companies that does the signs and Ron will do a price comparison.

£2.000 to £2.5000 to buy the fixed permanent.

It was suggested we could do our own survey in co-ordination with Lincs Police.

To ask the opinion of the other councillors at the next meeting.
